Recharter

- Ongoing Recharter Support
 - Commissioner attendance at Roundtables and Trappers.
- Recharter Results So Far (through Jan. 16), traditional 5 districts
 - Not in this cycle = 3
 - Dropped Units = 13, some being merged with other units
 - None had more than 9 youth
 - 2 were units created incorrectly by us (learning curve for new employees)
 - Units renewing = 184
 - Small Units with 10 or less youth = 74
 - Units posted or ready to post = 33
 - Units On-Hold = 38

As of Jan. 16, 2024 = 71 posted+hold. As of Jan. 21, 2023 = 45 posted+hold





Recharter

- Continued work to recharter packs by February 29 deadline
- After 2024 recharter ends, will turn attention to new renewal system
 - Members will renew individually starting March 1
 - Work with units to make sure member and unit Key 3 emails are current and understand how to track renewal deadlines
 - Develop processes to facilitate payments through units and council, especially for financial aid and popcorn credits







- C. Do five activities at home, at school, or in your den that use mathematics, and then explain to your den how you used everyday math.
- D. Make a rekenrek with two rows, and show your den leader or other adult how you would represent the numbers 4, 6, 9, and 14.
- E. Make a rain gauge or some other measuring device, and use it.
- 2. Complete one of the following:
- A. With other members of your den or family, identify three different types of shapes that you see in nature.
- B. With other members of your den or family, identify two shapes you can see in the construction of bridges.
- C. Select a single shape or figure. Observe the world around you for at least a week, and write down where you see this shape or figure and how it is used.
- 3. Complete one of the following:
- A. With your den, find something that comes with many small, colored items in one package. Count the number of items of each color in your package. Keep track of each color. Then:
 - Draw a graph showing the number of items of each color.

- ii. Determine what the most common color is.

- v. Decide if your prediction was close.
- B. With your den or family, measure the height of everyone in the group and see who takes more steps to walk 100 feet.
