

Cub Scouts - Ages 5-10

Cub Scouting is a year-round program uniquely designed to meet the needs of young children and their parents. The program offers fun and challenging activities that promote character development and physical fitness.



Scouts BSA - Ages 11-17

Scouting is an outdoor program designed to develop character, citizenship and fitness. With the Scout Oath and Law as a guide, Scouting helps young people develop into well-rounded adults. Earning Merit Badges provides opportunities for Scouts to discover a lifelong hobby or rewarding career.



Sea Scouts - Ages 13-21

Sea Scouts are a part of the Scout movement, with a particular emphasis on boating and other water-based activities on the sea, rivers or lakes (canoeing, rafting, scuba, sailboarding). Sea Scouts can provide a chance to sail, cruise on boats, learn navigation, learn how to work on engines and compete in regattas.

Cub Scout Program Updates

Exciting News for Cub Scouts in 2024-25! Get ready for some fantastic updates as we enhance the Cub Scout program. This coming year will positively change the Bobcat badge, Cub Scout Adventures, Webelos, and Cub Scout Awards. From a revamped Bobcat Adventure to improved Cub Scout Adventures and a reimagined approach to Webelos and Arrow of Light, these changes are designed to make the program even more engaging and age-appropriate for youth and more accessible and streamlined for adult leaders.

Some highlights include:

- · All Cub Scouts Awards will be reimagined and included as Cub Scout Adventures. Topics like camping, STEM, and range and target sports will remain and are reimagined into elective Adventures that can be used towards earning a badge of rank.
- · Cub Scout Adventures have also been aligned across grade levels to make it easier to deliver the program to multi-grade dens or as a Pack.
- Each Cub Scout rank will require a Cub Scout to earn the six required Adventures and two elective Adventures. Required Adventures reflect the aims and focus areas of the BSA. The number of elective Adventures increases.
- Bobcat will no longer be a badge earned at joining. It will become a required Adventure for each rank and will be completed yearly. The requirements for the Bobcat Adventure are different for each grade to make them age-appropriate.
- Webelos and Arrow of Light will be separated. Webelos becomes the 4th-grade program in Cub Scouting. Webelos dens for 5th graders are now Arrow of Light dens focused on skills that prepare Cub Scouts to join Scouts BSA.

The changes will take effect officially on June 1, 2024.









God & Country Award Clinic



An opportunity to work on Merit Badges and camp. This event fills up fast, don't wait to sign up!





A fun banquet to recognize Quivira Council leaders, Silver Beaver recipients, and Eagle Scouts from the previous year.





Cerified Angling Instructor Weekend

This is a BSA National certification for registered adult leaders and youth 16 years old, to instruct and promote the BSA Fishing Program through BSA activities. Participants will learn how to conduct fishing education classes at the Cub, BSA, and Venturing levels as well as how to conduct fishing events for BSA events as well as for recruiting/civic activities. Participants will complete their training and then be expected to participate in delivery of material and hands on application, through working as a group to conduct a fishing merit badge course on Saturday and Sunday for Scouts.

Those that complete the course will also have met the requirement to Certified Angling Instructors for the State of Kansas. These concepts are provided by our training team through presentations, games, discussions, activities, and hands-on methods. Be advised, we have a lot of Fun!!!

Fishing is an important event that promotes the values of Scouting, while being an engaging sport that ALL Scouters can be involved in. Fishing is often an overlooked resource for recruiting and engaging youth in a community. Properly trained Adults can help maximize a Unit's activities through providing EXCELLENT events that help with retention and improve the quality of Unit events.

Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO)

BALOO is a training course for Cub Scout leaders who want to take their Cub Scouts on overnight camping trips. It is an introduction to outdoor camping skills as well as important BSA rules and policies to be followed on any Cub Scout campout. The training is a two part training. The first part is available online at my.scouting.org. The second part is an instructor-led course that is conducted at the Council level. This one and one-half day in person course is designed as an introduction to the Cub Scout outdoor program for those leaders (Cubmasters, Ass't. Cubmasters, Den leaders, other pack leaders, and parents) who are interested in adding a camping component to their Pack activities. BSA's Cub Scout level camping policies will be taught along with the necessary tools to help units carry out a successful camping experience. Both parts must be completed to get credit for this training.



National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) is an exciting and powerful program designed to provide members of Troops, Crews, & Ships (ages 13 and over) with leadership skills and experience they can use to lead themselves and others. This six-day-long outdoor experience represents a month in the model life of a typical Scout unit. The NYLT course centers on the concepts of what a leader must BE, KNOW, and DO.

The objectives of the course are to:

- Provide a toolbox of leadership skills
- Relate these skills to leading in their unit
- Instill knowledge and confidence to run the unit
- Enhance relationship between the Scout and the unit
- Share ideas and experiences with other Scouts
- Experience Scouting at its best
- Have fun!

The six days are split between two weekends at Camp Durant. This course is designed to complement leadership training at the unit level and is a follow on to Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops.



An opportunity to work on Merit Badges and camp. This event fills up fast, don't wait to sign up!






